#### What is WDSRA?

Western DuPage Special Recreation Association (WDSRA) is a cooperative extension of 9 member Park Districts.

WDSRA provides a variety of recreation and leisure services for individuals who have special needs.

WDSRA Serves: Bloomingdale, Carol Stream, Glen Ellyn, Naperville, Roselle, Warrenville, West Chicago, Wheaton, & Winfield.

# What does WDSRA offer?

We also offer inclusion services in collaboration with our 9

Member Park Districts.

# Who is eligible for inclusion?

Any individual who registers for a program in one of WDSRA's member park districts and has a special need is eligible to receive inclusion services.

# What is the cost for inclusion?

Inclusion services are provided at no cost through WDSRA and the member park districts. Participants must pay the park district program fees, but there is no additional cost for inclusion support.



# What type of supports are provided?

Reasonable accommodations can include the following: providing behavior management support, training for the instructors, sign language interpreters, adaptive materials and equipment, ability awareness training, and the provision of a support staff member to assist the individual in the program.

# How does the inclusion process work?

- When you register for a Park District program, indicate that the participant needs accommodations.
- The Park District will inform WDSRA that you have requested accommodations. When they have done so, a confirmation email will be sent to you.
- If you don't get the confirmation email, reach out to the Park District to ensure that they are aware of the need for accommodations.
- The WDSRA Inclusion team will reach out to you to obtain information regarding the participant's needs so that we can determine what type of support is needed for the participant to be successful.

# **Tips for a Positive Inclusion Experience**

We strongly believe that increased communication will improve the experiences of all involved.



If it is determined that accommodations should be provided, it is important that WDSRA have advance notice: we request a minimum of 2 weeks advance notice to secure necessary accommodations. During peak periods, or when there are specific needs, it may take longer than 2 weeks.

- when a support staff is secured, we will email you their contact info. We encourage support staff to contact families prior to the start of the program. If the staff member doesn't have the opportunity to contact you, please feel free to call them at a time that is convenient for you.
- If the participant will not be able to attend the program on a particular day or you are made aware of change in the program details, please let the support staff member know directly.
- If you feel that there is an issue which needs to be addressed throughout the course of the program, please bring it to our attention immediately so we can take steps to address your concern in a timely fashion.
- Please provide us with your feedback at the conclusion of each season. WDSRA will email a link to an evaluation form and would greatly appreciate any feedback you provide.
- Please help us to ensure that support staff members are adequately prepared with up-to-date information by contacting us whenever there is a change in accommodation needs.
